5. WHAT DID YOU DISLIKE MOST ABOUT THIS INSTRUCTOR AND COURSE?

- * There was nothing I disliked about this course.
- * For an online course, assignment deadlines mimicked that of a weekly face-to-face class structure. My reason for taking an online course in the first place was to accommodate a work schedule which prevented me from strict time frames. That being said, the pace of ENGL 328W was unnecessarily challenging and completely unsympathetic to the needs of the working student demographic which populated the class roster. On more than one occasion the strict requirements of the class forced me to find ways to submit assignments on fifteen minute breaks at my day job; this is ridiculous.
- * There was a lot of work, and deadlines frequently came swiftly.
- * Having to check in with the course page every few days, as opposed to on my own time. The point of an online class is to allow the student a more free schedule. Since I work full time and have children, it made it slightly more difficult to make sure I met mid-week deadlines, and 4pm deadlines (as opposed to midnight).
